The Regular Monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Men's Garden club of Albany, was held on Thursday evening, April 2, 1987, in the Cerebral Palsy Center for the Disabled.

The meeting was called to order by President **Joe Huth** at 7:37, with 15 Club members present.

The Minutes of the March 5, 1987 meeting were approved as read by the Club Secretary, **Tom Baker**.

The Treasurer's Report was approved as read by **Paul Hughes**, the Club Treasurer. As of March 31, 1987, in the General Fund there was a total balance on hand of \$1,732.74, and in the Advantage Account there was \$5,364.47.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE: **Bob Ireland**, Chairman, reporting. We have a total membership of 96 members, 17 of which are Life Members. He is also working on a new membership application form.

GARDENING FROM THE HEART: **Al Miller**, Chairman, reporting. The National Gardening from the Heart Committee is in the process of raising money for a Scholarship Fund pertaining to Therapeutic Gardening Education. **Al** has envelopes for the purpose of making Memorial contributions. These Memorials may be for such things as Birthdays, Anniversaries, Deaths, Etc.

Also: Wally Dillenbeck reported that Heather Iffland of Schenectady, presented him with a check for \$10.00 to be used at the Center Project. She earned this money by making and selling Brownie Cookies. (the Club Secretary has sent Heather a letter of thanks.) this young Girl Scout learned of our project from Jerry Flax's article in the area News Papers. PLANT SALE COMMITTEE: Herman Mau, Chairman, reporting. It is requested that the callers for the Ladies Night Dinner ask the members what and how many plants they are going to bring to the sale. Also: Don Stevens is taking orders for Tuberous Begonias; at \$1.25 for each or \$5.50 for 5 plants.

This project took years to get State and Federal approvals and lots of hard work from members of the Garden Club of Albany. ps. Along with perennials, shrubs and trees, there are plaques that lists the names of our club members that have Gone to Rest.







35 = years supporting one or two locations every Wednesday for 35 years

4 = the (low) average number of MGCA volunteers on site

50 = sessions per year and for years 100 sessions per year (50 /site)

2 = Hours on site per session - 9:00am - 11:00am

= ~15 years x 50 weeks/year x 4 people / site x 2 sites === 6000 volunteer hours PLUS

= 20 years x 50 weeks/year x 4 people / site x 1 sites === 4000 volunteer hours

===== 10,000 hours of volunteer's time supporting the Gardening From The Heart program at the Centers for Disability Services by members of the Men's Garden Club of Albany. =======

Add to that, prep time, construction of a huge greenhouse and many raised beds and you'll see that the 10,000 hours is only a portion of the time our members have spent supporting this great program.

We owe a big thanks to Al Miller and Tom Baker for initiating this project back in 1984.

Tom Baker and **Al Miller** started working on founding the Gardening From the Heart program way back in 1984 but he may say that it really didn't start until 1985. Originally our club had two teams of members that would teach classes, every Wednesday, at two locations with the adults at 700 S. Pearl St. in Albany and with the children at 314 Manning Blvd in Albany, NY. COVID-19 restrictions kept us out of the building, and we're waiting to hear what the next steps are for our activities at the 700 South Pearl St. location.







